From the Pastor

Beloved of God,

As we approach Pentecost, we are reminded of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. This is the birth of the church and the beginning of a new era in God's redemptive history. Pentecost is a day of celebration and remembrance for us as believers. We celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit, who empowers us to live out our faith and share the gospel with others. We remember the birth of the church and the early disciples' boldness in proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ.

Church Council Minutes

April 4, 2023

Present: Pastor Liz, Deb Gehrke, Tom Christensen, Ginny Grabow, Jim Grabow, Terri Heimerman, Julie Rogers Pastor Liz opened the meeting with prayer.

Secretary's report: The minutes of the March meeting have been approved.

Financial report: The financial report for March will be received via email and will be reviewed at our next meeting.

- Discussion of church/parsonage insurance—very high trying to find ways to decrease. This year it falls within budgeted amounts, but is likely to have a big future increase.
- Motion by Julie/ Jim seconded to retain Brian Block and add council President and VP as signatories on church accounts with Hometown Bank Cleveland.

Our office assistant, Angie Knott, will be leaving mid to late June dur to a change of job locations for her husband. We will soon be posting our need for a new parttime office assistant. We thank Angie for her service to Pastor Liz and our church family.

Old Business:

- A male volunteer is needed to represent Our Savior's at Synod Assembly in Mankato on May 6th.
- The date for the Spring Yard Sale, to benefit the youth fund will be announced. Members are encouraged to bring in gently used items to be sold. The church will be adding some items to the sale, which will be scheduled in May, ahead of the city's pick up day.
- Spring outdoor clean-up will be scheduled for late April, early May. Lots of help will be needed. Pastor will supply treats for the workers.
- Membership project—some who were inactivated need to be restored to active status before the list is finalized.
- Technology –Scott Lassiter has made adjustments and online worship is working well at this point.

New Business:

- Information on our webpage has been partially updated. (Pastor and Angie) They will look at necessary updates after Easter.
- College care packages. Terri will help with packing and distributing the care packages for our college freshmen.
- Last meeting, Deb sent out job assignments as reminders to council. It was decided that was helpful & she will continue to do so
- Tom got estimates for roof repair on the church and parsonage. Heyn Brothers and Hanson Roofing gave estimates. Estimates include actions necessary to make the roof performance better. We noted the huge ice problems we had this winter. Heyn Brothers—30-year warranty asphalt—\$31,200, 50-year steel--\$62,000
 - Hanson—50-year warranty architectural asphalt—56,000,
 - The parsonage shingles are pretty good and can wait, but the Church replacement is critical—there was previous damage to the shingled portions of the church, which was not noticed to put in a timely insurance claim. We discussed how to fund roof repairs. Other churches have had some success with a "Buy a Bundle" campaign. Further discussion at our next meeting.
- The large elm in the parsonage backyard should be removed. It presents a danger to the parsonage if it were to fall. Tom has an estimate for removal by Jeremy Scheuer. He will take it down, grind the stump and smaller branches for \$600. The burnable wood has been claimed by a church member and will be removed from the premise. Jim moved to approve tree removal; Terri seconded. Motion passed.
- **Lawn mowing**—Aaron and Julie Rogers will mow church and parsonage lawns during the summer months, when school is not in session. Jim Grabow and Bob Gehrke will mow when the Rogers are not able to mow.
- Terri will prepare a list for church interior cleaning which will begin in June. She will also send out two/month thank you cards to those who have served OSLC as volunteers.

Next Council meeting—May 7, 2023 after worship.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
