

Church Council Minutes

May 7, 2023

Present: Pr. Liz, Deb Gehrke, Tom Christensen, Terri Heimerman, Jim Grabow, Ginny Grabow Pastor Liz opened the meeting with prayer.

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the April meeting were approved with a motion by Tom, second by Terri.

Financial Report: Brian Block presented the financial reports for March and April

- In March, the general fund received gifts of \$9,320.51 versus last year of \$7,746.76 giving us a difference of \$1,573.75. Year to date giving for March was \$29,751.56, giving us a difference of \$5,338.20.
- April gifts: The general fund received gifts of \$9,660.51 versus last year of \$11,190.75, giving us a difference of (\$1,530.24).
 Checkbook balance at the end of April is \$13,768.48. Year to date, gifts of \$39,412.07 versus last year of \$35,604, giving us a difference of \$3,807.96.

Old Business:

- While Brian was in attendance, we continued discussion on the cost of insuring the church and parsonage. Deb worked with
 the agent to find ways to decrease the amount due. The premium of \$9,736.74/year has been paid. The insurance company
 wants an inventory of all removable assets of the church (chairs, tables, hymnals, etc.) to have an estimate of replacement
 cost. We will work on this during the summer months.
- Tom presented the estimates on replacing original shingles that are damaged. We have noticed interior damage to ceiling tiles and standing water after heavy rains in the last years. We reviewed three estimates and have judged that the estimate from Boelter for Class 3 shingles with a 40-year warranty will be the best option at a cost of \$33,429. Motion by Terri/second by Deb. Motion passed. In preparing estimates, the roofing contractors noted that the present shingles sustained hail damage, but with no inspection on our part, we failed to put in a claim. We need to be vigilant following future hail storms to check roof condition. There are also spongy areas that need to be fixed. We will discuss ways to encourage gifts to help with the cost of this vital up-keep. A congregational meeting will be held on June 4 to discuss and vote on the roof expenditure above \$5,000, as dictated by our constitution.

Other items discussed under Old Business:

- Continuing to encourage automatic giving.
- Posting of vacancy for Office Assistant (vacancy probable end of June).
- Deb will work with Angie on updating membership information on the office computer.
- We continue to track the online worship numbers.
- The need to update portions of our website regularly.
- Synod Assembly (Pr. Liz & Chris Thomas attended) Lots of information shared on the work of the ELCA.
- Adopt-a-Highway-Done with many helpers, organized by Julie Rogers.
- Church and parsonage yards were spring-cleaned with volunteer help. Thanks to all who helped.
- Dead tree in parsonage yard has been removed.
- Terri has assembled and mailed the College Care Packages.

New Business:

- Upcoming events on the calendar were reviewed
- Summer Bible Fellowship will begin on May 31 at 11:00 am.
- Confirmation and Graduate recognition in May.
- Registrations for 5 Bible Campers are in. Thank you, Ginger McCabe for assisting.
- Summer cleaning of the church and inspecting areas that need fresh paint.
- God's Work Our Hands, 9/10/23
- The Rogers family has volunteered to mow the church and parsonage lawns after the school year is done. Jim Grabow & Bob Gehrke will mow when Aaron & Julie are not available.

Next Council meeting—June 4th after the congregational meeting
