#### Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes September 13, 2023

Members present: Deb Gehrke, Pastor Liz, Tom Christensen, Terri Himerman, Julie Rogers, Jim Grabow, Ginny Grabow

Meeting opened with a devotional activity & prayer presented by Julie.

Brian Block presented financial information. For the month of August, the general fund received gifts of \$9,278.00 versus last year of \$7,271.20, giving us a difference of \$2006.80. Year to date the general fund received gifts of \$78,314.72 versus last year's \$73,424.46, a difference of \$4,890.26. When we committed to roof replacement, funds were borrowed from the memorial fund. Generous gifts from our church family have covered about 80% of the total cost, with the remaining balance to be paid by funds in the memorial account. This payback of funds will occur before year end 2023. Gratitude was expressed for the generosity of the people of Our Savior's in gifting funds for the roof repairs. Brian also presented a projection of our financial condition through year's end if gifts remain constant. Brian presented possible changes in Pr. Liz's health insurance plan. It was decided to stay with the present plan for the coming year.

The minutes of the August meeting were approved.

#### **Old Business:**

- The summer church cleaning is complete & Deb and Ginny are conducting an inventory of removable church property at the request of our insurance company.
- Julie reported on VBS. We had many happy children and adult volunteers. It was four evenings of fun and learning about how we can also be heroes like the heroes of the Bible. The children enjoyed music led by Kevin & Lacee Johnson, a lesson in the form of a puppet show (scripts written by Julie Rogers), activities, and recreation led by Aaron Rogers. Thanks to all who were a part of these evenings of learning and fun.
- God's Work Our Hands Sunday was moved indoors due to weather conditions on September 10. Following worship, more than 30 hygiene kits were packed for use at the school and the Food Shelf. A delicious potluck was enjoyed after the work was done.
- Pastor Liz explained how the Mutual Ministry Committee will work. She will write a description of the committee's work and distribute it to the council.
- Giving Tree will be started soon. Terri will check on how to proceed.

#### **New Business:**

- The OSLC Events Calendar was used to plan activities for the coming months. Some possible activities: A progressive dinner, if there is sufficient interest, Lefse making, College care packages for new college students from Our Savior's.
- God Squad will begin on September 20 with an ice cream social. Pr. Liz will meet with parents to discuss the coming year.
- Fall yard clean-up will be scheduled soon. The dry conditions this year will change how we will proceed. Shrubs need to be planted on the west side of the church this fall after the old plants are removed. Tom & Jim will decide on when to schedule the clean-up.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Payer. Next council meeting on October 8 following worship.
