


Council Minutes

October 8, 2023

Members present: Pastor Liz, Deb Gehrke, Tom Christensen, Terri Himerman, Julie Rogers, Jim Grabow, Ginny Grabow. Ginny provided the meditation/prayer for the meeting.

The financial report for September was presented by Brian Block:

The general fund received gifts of \$8,592.51 versus last year of \$7,335.39, giving us a difference of \$1,254.12. Year to date the general fund received gifts of \$86,804.97 versus last year's \$80,759.85, a difference of \$6,045.12. The checkbook balance was \$12,964.09, less payback to the memorial fund of \$10,699.49, leaving a balance of \$2,264.60. Terri moved to accept the report, with a second by Tom. Motion approved.

Heating/AC Unit:

The HVAC rooftop unit on the south side of the church, near the bell tower, has failed and is beyond repair. Since this unit cools and heats, the council needs to act to replace it soon. The sanctuary is only being heated by the unit on the north side, which is stressing that unit. Tom has estimates from two HVAC businesses:

Kelly Plumbing and Heating--\$10,710 for a Carrier unit without an economizer, which is not needed for our application.

Always There from LeCenter--\$12,743, also without an economizer.

A congregational meeting will be required since these estimates exceed the amount dictated by our constitution, Pastor Liz will send out an email today announcing a congregational meeting following worship on October 22. Council voted to accept the Kelly Plumbing & Heating bid since it was lower and that firm has worked with our system in the past.

Old Business:

Newly employed office assistant, Jan Rustman, is learning the job well and will be an asset to the office, Pastor, and our congregation.

Pr. Liz explained the workings of the Mutual Ministry Committee (duties & expectations). Their function will be goal oriented, not task oriented—to enhance our ministry together here.

Deb and Ginny are nearly finished with the inventory of church property.

The clothesline in the parsonage backyard and the stumps of old shrubs were removed by Jim Struck. New shrubs have been planted on the west side of the church. Some areas of the parsonage backyard will require attention when the fall yard work is done.

Jim is getting estimates for a backyard fire pit at the parsonage.

Gift cards are planned for our two 2023 high school graduates.

Looking ahead—the terms of Tom Christensen and Terri Himerman end in January.

New Business:

Our events calendar was reviewed

Fall yard work is tentatively planned for October 28th.

There will be a stewardship emphasis later in October. Hunger boxes (in the form of little pigs) will be returned to church in November.

A progressive dinner or adult dinner out was discussed.

Lefse making event will be on November 11, 9:00 am till noon in the church kitchen area.

The Giving Tree will be announced in the November newsletter. We will sponsor 8 children, which means 24 gifts. Tags with items needed will be out 11/27, with items to be returned to church within two weeks. Items should not be wrapped, but put into bags for pick-up.

We will need to engage a plow service to plow our parking lots this winter. Anyone who is able to make a suggestion as to who might be available locally should contact Tom Christensen.

Next council meeting will be held after worship on November 12, Deb will provide the meditation.

Meeting adjourned with the praying of The Lord's Prayer.
