

From the Pastor

In the evenings, when I let my puppies outside, I've been lamenting the fact that it gets dark so early. One day this past week I barely made it back to Cleveland before the sun set at 4:30ish! Though it may be dark and dreary for the majority of each day (less than 9 hours of day light as I write this...), this is a season of hope and light for the Christian faith.

One of my favorite parts of the Holden Evening Prayer service is when we recite John 1:5: "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." It's almost as if the early church knew that we in the Northern hemisphere needed that extra bit of help to make it through the darkest part of the year. I remember when I was little, the Christmas season seemed like the culmination of the fall semester in school. Though much of my work in ministry still follows a program year, I am increasingly mindful of our world's need for the light of Christ.

A couple of nights ago, I saw the flashing lights and sirens of emergency responders going down the highway. My first prayer was that those I love be safe from harm. My next prayer was "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." It is a song and a fervent plea. In this season we all pray: Come and change the world as you did so long ago, as you promise to do here and now. Come and bring peace, bring hope, bring light to a world in desperate need. So, come let us adore him, the one for whom we wait, the one who is already here.

Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes November 12, 2023

Members present: Pastor Liz, Deb Gehrke, Tom Christensen, Terri Heimerman, Julie Rogers, Ginny Grabow. Deb provided a meditation about serving as a leader, which was read in unison.

The financial report for October was presented by Brian Block:

The general fund received gifts of \$12,745.75 in October versus last year of \$12,748.63, a difference of (\$2.88). Year to date the general fund received gifs of \$99,550.72 versus last year's \$93,508, a difference of \$6,042.24. Brian presented projected gifts for the rest of 2023, as well as the proposed budget for 2024. The financial report was accepted on a motion by Julie and second by Tom. Tom moved we accept the proposed salary/benefit package for Pastor Liz, second by Terri. Motion passed. Council needs to accept the proposed budget for 2024 at the December meeting. There was discussion concerning how the cost of snow removal will impact the new budget.

Due to changes to business accounts, by Pay Pal, the council recommended applying for a debit card for online purchases instead of Pay Pal. Deb will check on procedure to secure a card.

Brian proposed sending out letters to the congregation updating contributions thus far in 2023. It was also decided to resume passing the offering plate within the worship service.

The October minutes were approved on a motion by Terri, second by Tom.

The new HVAC unit was installed on November 6.

Old Business:

Trunk & Treat was again a successful community outreach project.

Fall yard clean-up. Dean Heimerman took care of leaves, Bob Gehrke cleaned parsonage gutters. Others will meet on Nov 13 to finish trimming, etc.

New Business:

- -The piggy ELCA Hunger boxes will be collected in November—Sundays & Wednesdays.
- -Thanksgiving worship-Nov 19, 9:00 a.m. with a Pie Social following worship.
- -Wednesday Advent worship will begin on November 29 in order to have four Advent services. Choir practice for Christmas special music will follow immediately after worship.
- -A winter activity event for youth is in the planning stages. Julie Rogers and Andi Lassiter are considering a movie/pizza evening.
- -Deb met with a sound system company representative to get an estimate on some extra speakers for the rear of the church.
- -Tom & Terri's terms on council expire in January but they are willing to continue to serve. We can add one more member. Election of council members will take place at the Annual -- Meeting on January 28th. If you want to serve, notify a council member.
- -Next meeting Dec 10 after worship. Pr. Liz will offer the devotional.
