Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. - Acts 2:46-47

Gathering around a good meal is a very Christian thing to do. If you were to ask a person of faith to share one of their favorite experiences in Christian community, chances are it would involve fellowship around the table. ### Our Savior's Lutheran Church Council Minutes January 14, 2024

Council members present: Pr Liz, Deb Gehrke, Terri Heimerman, Julie Rogers, Jim Grabow, Ginny Grabow (Guests—Vicki Walechka and Scott Lassiter)

Jim shared a devotional based on Psalm 91.

Vicki asked if we would resume soup and sandwich suppers before Lenten services. Council would like to resume more of the activities we had pre-COVID. It was decided to offer these suppers on February 21, through the following weeks of Lent, with the possibility of also serving on March 20th, depending on attendance. The four serving groups will coordinate this activity.

### **Old Business:**

Discussion on Internet service to the church with Scott Lassiter and Jim taking the lead. Jim will ask the Church of Christ what service they have found to work for them. We hope to be finished with Mediacom by March 1, since they have raised their monthly fee to nearly \$280. We are looking for a reliable, but more affordable option.

There have been complaints about our 20-year-old sound system. Deb has received a quote tor adding speakers in the sanctuary. The cost for two extra speakers would be \$1969.18. The decision was made, Motion by Jim, second by Ginny, to have two speakers installed in the spring after the Internet service is firmed up.

Brian Block presented the financials for December, as well as a preliminary view of the proposed 2024 budget.

The general fund received gifts of \$25,470.58 versus last year of \$27,964.91 giving us a difference of \$2,494.33. The checkbook balance at year's end was \$10,507.25. Year to date, the general fund received gifts of \$134,104.74 versus last year's \$131,088.55, a difference of \$3,016.19. Council suggested some small changes to the 2024 budget, which will be voted on at the Annual Meeting on 1/28, The minutes of the December meeting were approved.

### New Business:

- A Night Out/Adult Fellowship is being planned for February 17, 6:00 at Kokomos. Regular menu. Watch for a sign-up sheet if you wish to attend this evening of food and fellowship with your friends from Our Savior's.
- A youth movie & amp; pizza night is planned for February 7 at church. (Grades 7-12)
- Pastor Liz will offer a First Communion Workshop on March 23.
- Green Lake Bible Camp information for 2024 has been sent out.
- Mid-week Lenten services begin on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 6:30 with choir practice following.

Motion to adjourn by Julie/Terri second. Adjourned with The Lord's Prayer. Next meeting on February 11 following worship.

### Ash Wednesday


