Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Council Minutes

December 10, 2023

Members present: Pastor Liz, Deb Gehrke, Tom Christensen, Terri Heimerman, Julie Rogers, Jim Grabow, Ginny Grabow. Terri, presented a devotional concerning God and our goals.

Scott Lassiter was present to help council understand our needs concerning the Internet in view of Mediacom greatly increasing our monthly cost. This equipment is necessary to have Wi-Fi in the church for many reasons...email, storing documents on the cloud, newsletter production, any use of the Internet, etc. Jim explored the possibility of using a Netgear Nighthawk M6 unit which would cost \$65/month. Mediacom has raised our monthly payment to \$276.63/month. Jim will see if AT&T has a test unit we could use to check the viability of this unit for our application. Tom suggested if we go that route that we should plan to install an external antenna since he has had experience using a similar unit. If we decide to drop Mediacom, they need to have a 30-day notice, giving us time to do more research. Since Mediacom handles our landline phones, we will have to see about picking them up with Century Link.

Brian Block presented the November financial report: The general fund received gifts of \$9,081.00 versus last year of \$9,612.16 giving us a difference of (531.16). Checkbook balance is \$3,744.65. The memorial fund has been repaid for the roof advance. Year to date; The general fund received gifts of \$108.631.72 versus last year's \$103,120.64, giving a difference of \$5,511.08. Brian also presented a preliminary 2024 budget, which the council will need to approve prior to the Annual Meeting on January 28, 2024. The financial report was approved in a motion by Julie, second by Tom.

Snowplowing: Tom presented three estimates for plowing church parking lots. Council accepted Bobcat One at \$100/occurrence on a motion by Jim, second by Julie. The plowing will be paid through Building & Grounds maintenance fund, not by a budget line item. Motion by Tom, second by Terri.

Council minutes for November were accepted. Motion by Deb, second by Jim.

New Business:

Discussion of Stewardship emphasis. Julie will work with Pr. Liz to write up information to share with the congregation.

The Project List was reviewed.

Julie has been working on an activity evening for the youth...maybe pizza and a service project connected to God Squad.

Children's Christmas Program on December 17. Treat bags for the children will be prepared on December 16, at the church by council.

Terri & Tom are willing to serve another term on council.

Next meeting January 14, following worship. Jim will provide the devotional time. Annual Meeting January 28, 2024. Note: All reports to be inserted into the 2023 Annual Report are due January 14.

Meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.
