

From the Pastor

Beloved.

This month to share an Advent reflection from one of my mentors, Dr. Karoline Lewis. She wrote this piece for the website Working Preacher:

The charge to keep awake during this Advent season is not just about waiting and anticipation. It is not just about getting ready or being ready because can you ever be ready for Christ's coming? Can we ever be ready for God entering into humanity, into our sinfulness and brokenness, into our pain and loss, into our joy, into our love, into our longing?

The answer is no, and Advent will never be long enough. That's the point. God arrives, regardless of our readiness. God shows up, despite our determination toward manifesting our own destiny. God will come, no matter what kind of stipulations or conditions or provisions we make to persuade God of our timeliness.

Our time is oriented by God's. time -- always has been and always will be. God entered into our time, forever changing it. God lived time with us, forever altering what time really means.

Ultimately, God's entering into time disrupts time, displaces time, disorients time. Not always comfortably. Not always helpfully. Not always desirably. And never how or when expectable. Why? Because divinity took on mortality, eternity entered temporality, and love eliminated death. This... is the meaning of Advent time.

Our Sunday worship theme for Advent and Christmas this year is "The Will to Dream." In a time when trust feels fragile and divisions run deep, The Will to Dream calls us into holy longing—a sacred desire for a world made whole. On Wednesday evenings we'll sing of God's amazing saving act of Emmanuel, God with us, through Holden Evening Prayer.

Year to date, the General Fund received gifts of \$106,094.75 versus last year of \$102,012.45 giving us a difference of \$\$4,082.30. The financial report was approved on a motion by Jim, second by Betty/approved.

- Tree removal—nothing new to report

 do some training, but would like to be done the week before Christmas.
- Reviewed events calendar and project list. Adjustments were made.
